## **1. Unemployed or Underemployed Individuals**

People who are out of work or not working enough hours to meet their financial needs. This group includes those who have been laid off, those in transition between jobs, and those seeking their first job.

## **2. Low-Income Individuals and Families**

People living below the poverty line or struggling to make ends meet. They often require assistance to improve their financial stability and access to better employment opportunities.

## **3. Individuals with Limited Education or Skills**

People who may not have completed high school, obtained a GED, or lack specific job skills. They often need additional training, education, or certifications to improve their employment prospects.

## **4. Veterans**

Former military personnel who may face unique challenges in transitioning to civilian employment. They might require specialized support to translate their military experience into civilian job skills.

## **5. People with Disabilities**

Individuals with physical, mental, or developmental disabilities who may need accommodation or specialized support to find and maintain employment.
